

Moving Ahead in Madagascar

Two people who graduated from ACCTS' 2008 Chaplains Interaction training program, Chaplain Micael Rakotozafy and Mrs. Suzanne Rakotozafy, emailed an update on the work of military chaplains in Madagascar. Chaplain Rakotozafy is in his tenth year as chief chaplain in Madagascar.

During the last ten years ministry has moved ahead -- five new chapels have been built, bringing the number to 15, and the nation has four military chaplains and ten civilian chaplain volunteers. Chaplain Rakotozafy trains them once a year. Additionally, he visits all six military divisions around the nation, which involves a great deal of travel in an older vehicle. He writes, "This year we plan to print 5,000 camouflage military Bibles, [which cost] 7 US dollars for each Bible; we invite you to pray for this."
