

How do I apply for I-RMH?



Participants are nominated by prior attendees, MCF leaders, and staff members of ACCTS, Military Ministries International (UK), and Missionary Support Organization (ROK).

Candidates must be Christians, have a working knowledge of English, be available for the entire training program, and be capable of engaging in strenuous physical activity.

Interaction – Rocky Mountain High (I-RMH)

Is God calling you to learn how to integrate your faith with your military career? Do you want to be a military Christian leader with vision? If you're a young US or international military midshipman, cadet, junior officer, or young enlisted personnel, Interaction-Rocky Mountain High may be for you.

ACCTS' mission is to assist in the development of Christian leaders in the armed forces of the world and in the establishment and growth of military Christian fellowships (MCFs). We do this to achieve our vision that one day, every person in uniform will have heard the Gospel from someone wearing that same uniform.

I-RMH helps to accomplish that mission and fulfill our vision for the Lord. A joint venture between ACCTS and Officers' Christian Fellowship (OCF), the summer program is held at an OCF conference center and other locations in the Rocky Mountains of Colorado. The curriculum focuses on learning how to plan, lead, and grow a military Christian fellowship (MCF) while serving in the military. Participants learn how MCFs function, how they impact militaries and nations worldwide, and how each person's vision and growth in leadership and

ministry skills contributes to the MCF. Some of the topics covered in I-RMH include:

- † **Christian Leadership in the Military:** interaction and discussion with mature Christian leaders.
- † **Spiritual Development:** personal discipleship and group Bible study.
- † **Conversational Prayer:** learning to talk with God in personal and group contexts.
- † **Strategic Planning:** how to set achievable personal and group goals.
- † **Chaplains:** the importance of chaplains to military readiness, and how to support their ministry.
- † **Building and Sustaining Strong Relationships:** why spiritual relationships are important, and how to establish and sustain them.
- † **Military Service as a Ministry:** how to minister appropriately as a Christian in the military.



Building life-long relationships

These spiritual lessons are applied in activities such as:

- † Home stays with military Christians in the area.
- † Mountain climbing, rappelling, white-water rafting, mountain biking, and sports.
- † Visiting various points of interest in Colorado Springs and the Rockies.
- † Tours of the US Air Force Academy and other local military bases.



I-RMH builds Christian military leaders. A Korean Air Force cadet was so encouraged by his I-RMH experience that he began discipling others upon his return. A Polish cadet was asked to give a 15-minute presentation on his impressions of I-RMH – his talk lasted 35 minutes. A US participant is now an ACCTS board member.
