
Nine Months Away, But Scholarships Needed NOW!

Many of these believers serve in nations where fellowshipping with other believers isn't always possible, or where they face oppression or outright religious persecution.

From 15-20 October 2024, ACCTS is partnering with the military Christian fellowship of Brazil as they host the AMCF World Conference, a gathering specifically designed to empower, equip, and encourage military personnel from across the globe. ACCTS is raising funds to assist international participants who can't fully fund their own participation to the conference, because we know from previous experience that this conference has the potential to change lives and bring about Kingdom growth worldwide.

for Christ in their cultures and nations. To date we have received some scholarship funds but need more Christians to step forward and help. Your scholarship donation, whether large or small, makes a difference. A gift of \$2,500 can cover the full costs, including airfare, for one attendee. You can break your donations down into monthly gifts instead of a one-time larger gift. Gifts in smaller amounts will be combined to offer scholarships so that no one is turned away for lack of funds.

The 2024 World Conference is more than just a conference; it will be a beacon of hope, a reaffirmation of faith, and a powerful demonstration of Christian unity in the face of a challenging world. We are grateful to be in partnership with the military Christian fellowship of Brazil, which is hosting the 2024 AMCF World Conference. Former Executive Director Dell McDonald shares this story of ACCTS first ministry trip to that country: "Standing at the foot of the Corcovado (the statue of Christ the Redeemer) in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil on a clear day was exhilarating. My wife, Bette, and I were the guests of Pastor Schwartz-Lima, one of our first military contacts in Brazil. While standing there admiring the view, Pastor Lima - who was also an Air Force dentist - suggested we pray. The four of us circled together and prayed that God would gather godly military people and form a strong viable military Christian fellowship. 46 years later, the fellowship in Brazil has grown to tens of thousands of military and police and includes a chaplain corps and fellowship groups in every state of that nation."


